



## Transcript for Strip

### 002 — Rod Serling Narrates

Panel 1: A simple-looking house of modest size dominates the frame, with no one to be seen outside. Above this, the narration bar reads: *One domestic dwelling of no particular make or model, situated serenely in a neighborhood much like any other.*
